Public Hearings for Uses of State Shared Revenues and Adoption of 2024-25 Budget

The City Council will be meeting on June 24, 2024 at 7:00 pm at City Hall, 400 Main Street. A public hearing is scheduled for the purpose of receiving public comment on the uses of State Shared Revenues, as well as a public hearing to discuss the budget as approved by the Budget Committee. It is anticipated that after the public hearings and consideration of any public comments, a budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, will be adopted.

Help Us Save Water This Summer

Summer is here and it is time to think about our use of water and ways we can practice water conservation. Here is a list of suggestions;

- 1) For Your Lawn Set your irrigation system to operate during the early morning or late evening hours when the air temperature is cooler. Raise your mower deck height to help the grass to promote root growth and shade the soil reducing evaporation.
- 2) For Your Irrigation System Ensure your sprinkler heads are properly adjusted and not watering non-vegetated areas. Consider using a timer to avoid over-watering. Upgrade to a smart irrigation controller that adjusts watering schedules based on weather forecasts, soil moisture, and plant needs.
- 3) For Your Garden Apply a layer of mulch around plants and flower beds to retain moisture in the soil and reduce the need for watering. Use drip irrigation as it helps deliver water directly to the root zone reducing evaporation and water runoff.
- 4) In the Kitchen Using a dishwasher is generally more efficient than washing by hand. Reduce rinsing dishes and allow the dishwasher to remove excess food.
- 5) In the Bathroom Replace old shower heads, faucets, and toilets with new water conserving fixtures. The new fixtures drastically reduce the amount of water used without sacrificing performance.
- 6) In the Laundry Room Run the washing machine only with full loads. This maximizes the efficiency of the washer reducing water consumption. Invest in energy-efficient washing machines that use less water per load. Front loading washers typically use less water than top loaders.

By implementing these practices, we can collectively reduce water consumption in Cottage Grove and safeguard our water supply for future generations. Every drop saved adds up—especially when we work together as a community to protect our shared water resources.
